





Pan American SAMBO Championships Villavicencio - Colombia July 15 to 19, 2020 Biosecurity Protocol

This document has the purpose to inform, guide and guarantee before and during the Pan American SAMBO Championships which will take place on the city of Villavicencio – Colombia from the 15th to the 19th of July. It has been created according to the recommendations of the World Health Organization (WHO), from the International Olympic Committee, the International Labour Organization (ILO), with participation from the Medical and Antidoping Commission from FIAS and the Colombian SAMBO Federation, the event organizers.

1. SECURITY MEASURES - GENERAL INFORMATION

✓ **NEGATIVE PCR TEST** – Each member of the delegation can enter the country only with a negative PCR test realized within the past 72 hours, emitted by the approved national laboratory of the respective country. The medical certificate with the complete name and identification number of the participants must be sent directly to the organizer of the event via email: federacioncolombianasambo@gmail.com before arriving in the country or hotel / official event location.

NOTE: VACCINATION CERTIFICATE DOES NOT REPLACE PCR TEST







- ✓ HEALTH QUESTIONAIRE: Each accredited country must send a Health Questionnaire of auto declaration, firmed and confirming that none of the team members has not had any COVID-19 symptoms within the last 14 days and hasn't been in contact with anybody with symptoms or COVID-19 positive. The firmed Questionnaire must be sent to the organizer of the event via email: <u>federacioncolombianasambo@gmail.com</u> before your arrival at the country or the official hotel.
- MASKS ARE OBLIGATORY Each national team and associated personnel are obliged to have a sufficient mask source. The usage of a mask is obligatory for all the event participants. Exceptions are granted to athletes during their competition / match / warmup, on the dedicated area and to the referee that is using the whistle on the mat. The rest of the participants must be wearing a mask during the event.
- ✓ TEMPERATURE REGULATION CONTROL The athletes are obliged to complete the formulary that they will receive, where they will insert their body temperature. The temperature will be measured daily by the delegation chief, on the morning (07:00 – 09:00) and during the night (19:00–21:00). The complete formulary will be given to the organizer of the event when asked. The body temperature can be controlled by the event organizer at any time during the event.
- ✓ IN CASE OF SYMPTOMS In case that any symptoms similar to COVID-19 are detected, the representatives of the national teams will inform this immediately to the event organizer. The possibly infected person will be submitted to a medical control under a doctor appointed by the organization.







- ACCREDITED PARTICIPANTS BEHAVIOR It's necessary to follow strict security measures and to respect the approved standards: like social distancing, mask use, and hand hygiene. The contact between athletes must be a minimum, only when team tasks are necessary. It is prohibited to go out of "The Bubble". Any accredited participant that doesn't respect the security measures will be disqualified from the event or must realize an additional PCR test by their own means to return to "The Bubble". Spectators won't be allowed to enter the competition area.
- ✓ INSURANCE It is each teams responsibility to assure that, besides normal insurance, to be sufficiently ensured to cover any related cost to COVID-19. The organizer of the event and the FIAS do not accept any responsibility by any related claim of the cancelation of the event due to COVID-19 or medical costs by any disease related to COVID-19 that can affect a member of the delegation of a national federation during the event. The organizer of the event doesn't cover no other additional cost related to the disease "COVID-19".
- SOCIAL DISTANCING Psychical distancing must be respected and must be of a minimum 1,5 meters at all moments during the event. The exception is only given to the athletes and referees during bouts.
- MASSIVE GATHERINGS Any non-official meeting by the accredited participants is prohibited during the duration of the event







2. <u>SECURITY MEASURES - DURING THE EVENT</u>

- ✓ ACCREDITATION The accreditation will take place at the official hotel. The organizing committee will stablish the exact schedule of the accreditation and the team must mandatorily respect the order. Disinfection fluids and appropriate sanitary materials shall be provided for the members of the organization in charge of the accreditation process. A maximum of two (2) representatives of the respective national team shall be allowed with all the documents collected (passport, payment licenses) to proceed with the accreditation process.
- ACCOMODATION All the teams will be housed in the rooms of the official hotel where it is going to be diary disinfected by the cleaning staff of the hotel. The nutrition of the athletes will be in accordance with physical, religious and dietetics needs in accordance with the FIAS standards. Accredited participants will wear the mask in the accommodation area except in their own room.
- ✓ TRANSPORTATION- Transportation of athletes and staff will be done in separate buses. The disinfection of these buses will take place twice a day. The first disinfection will be after the athletes and staff are finally transported and the second will be done after the daily tasks are fully completed. Only accredited members can be transport with buses where the uses of mask (cover-mouth) will be mandatory. All accredited members are advised to stay at the venue of the competition for the rest of the event (one day of competition). The event organizer would secure the food that participants can be able to buy during the event.
- MEALS Disinfection liquids will be delivered at the entrance of the restaurant of the official hotel. An adequate distance, ideally 1.5 meters, shall be maintained at the restaurant tables.







- ✓ TRAINING PROCEDURE- The training process will be carried out in alignment with the plans of the national team in separate training facilities as well as in the training field. The mats can only be used by the athletes who must pass through specialized disinfection control points. Coaches and medical staff can also access the mats.
- ✓ MEDICAL CARE: Medical Care will be provided in accordance with the FIAS Medical Rules. Each member of the medical team will wear a mask, while during the procedures it will be mandatory to wear gloves, which will be discarded after it use. A separate health care room will be dedicated to infectology due to the ongoing pandemic. This room will be clearly marked. All participants with symptoms similar to COVID-19 will be evaluated here.
- ✓ HYGIENE OF THE MATS- All athletes must pass through the disinfection control points where the shoes will be disinfected. The cleaning of the mat will take place just before the competitions starts and at any necessary time during the competition, as stated in the FIAS Medical Rules. Disinfection fluids shall not harm the skin of the participants.
- ✓ SHARING EQUIPMENT- It is prohibited to share any type of equipment with other athletes such as uniform, gloves, helmet or SAMBO shoes during the event. FIAS will not provide athletes with any uniform, gloves, helmet or SAMBO shoes at this event.
- ✓ DOPING TEST: Doping tests shall be conducted in accordance with the FIAS and WADA current Anti-Doping Regulations. All necessary health measures shall be applied to minimise any risk of the spread of COVID-19. The tests will be conducted following the latest WADA/FIAS safety recommendations.







✓ VOLUNTEERS- All organizing committee staff who have contact with athletes must test the negative PCR test up to 48 hours before the beginning of the championships.

The organizers of the competition, the chief referee of the competition, the medical delegate of FIAS and the medical teams that attend the tournament are responsible for coordinating and controlling the appliance of this measures and requirements.

These requirements are obligatory for each of the accredited participants and organizers of the named event. Non-compliance of the requirements can be motive of disqualification of the participants of the competition. These security measures don't replace the active FIAS medical rules or current document approved by FIAS.

The organizing committee of the Pan American Championships and FIAS reserves the right to change the previous safety measurement according to the current epidemic situation in the country.

Note: It is important to mention that each delegation must take into account that its country has restrictions for entry to Colombia due to COVID-19, so that it also proceeds to comply with them and do not have any setbacks.
